

Green Product Directory Released Submitted by Leighton Deer

In the spirit of ASHRAE's commitment to sustainability, MASDeC (the Minnesota ASHRAE Sustainable Design Committee) has developed a Green Product directory for those members interested in products and services that may be used to support sustainable and environmental design. Over 100 products are listed with information and links explaining how the product may save energy, reduce water usage, and improve indoor air quality. The Green Product Directory was developed with the help of regional sales representatives to create a directory designed to educate and promote products that meet MASDeC's mission to advance energy and environmental performance of buildings through creation, exchange, and application of timely information about the art and science of heating, ventilation, air conditioning, and refrigeration (HVAC-R). LEED-NC Version 2.2 - the most widely accepted measurement of sustainable design, the Whole Building Design Guide, the MN Sustainable Design Guide, and Green Globes were used as the directory framework. While the directory listings are to be used as a valuable resource for sustainable engineering design, it is for informational purposes only and does not imply any endorsement by the MASDeC committee, ASHRAE, or any sustainable design rating systems.

MASDeC would like to thank all those who helped with the creation of the Green Product Directory and is looking forward to the continued development of the directory as the building industry moves toward innovative and environmental building performance. University of Minnesota Receives Research Grant

Research promotion is not something we often think about in terms of our "home town". The belief by most members then becomes that there is no impact locally to our fund raising efforts. This however is not the case. It is time to celebrate a local success in getting some of that research money. Tom Kuehn and company at the University of Minnesota have been awarded another research project from ASHRAE.

This project is entitled: <u>Method of Test to Evaluate Field Performance of Commercial Kitchen Ventilation Systems.</u>

The project is for TC 5 10 (Kitchen Ventilation) and has a one year time frame. In total the University of Minnesota has been granted \$94,048 for this project.

Society Information

ASHRAE Headquarters Renovation

ATLANTA – Once completed, ASHRAE's renovated headquarters building in Atlanta will feature two separate HVAC systems as part of its role as living lab.

ASHRAE's Board of Directors has given the project its final stamp of approval. ASHRAE staff will move into temporary offices in September. The renovation is expected to be completed in June 2008 at an estimated cost of \$5.4 million. The renovated building will feature a new learning center and will serve as a living lab.

"The living lab will support the ASHRAE research program with a rich resource of data on building, system and equipment performance, a demonstration of performance monitoring, and space for 'real world' investigations in an operating building," said Bill Harrison, ASHRAE president-elect who serves as chair of the committee overseeing the project.

Level one of the building will feature air-cooled multi-split variable refrigerant flow fan coil units with zoned inverter-driven outdoor heat pumps. Level two will feature ground source direct expansion heat pumps for cooling and heating.

Both systems will use a common dedicated outside air system (DOAS), served by a 100 percent outside air unit with energy recovery wheel, series desiccant dehumidification wheel, electrostatic enhanced filters and DX aircooled R410 multi-stage compressor/condensers.

ASHRAE plans to apply for a LEED Gold certification under the U.S. Green Building Council's Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design rating system.


